


I. Commercial import, export and transit (incl. mail and courier consignments)



^{*}Values match those of the comparable original articles; not included are 6659 drugs consignments, which were seized due to the Therapeutic Products Act.




Findings by categories of goods (commercial)

36.2 % clothing, 32.1 % handbags, 16.5 % watches & jewellery


■ Malaysia






Findings by categories of goods (tourist traffic)
